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Changing lifestyles ?

- Sustainable development, like resilience, have become major objectives for territorial governance in a few months.
- Awareness of a changing world in energy, ecological and digital transitions is becoming widespread.
- Urban and rural dwellers, businesses and politicians are starting to talk about changing lifestyles, ...
- ... and thinking about their own lifestyles and those of their neighbours ...
- This should lead them to think of a "transformation of territories"

Developing teleworking in education and business ?

Telework has become a mandatory consequence of confinement in 2020 to maintain children's education and economic activity, but with strong limitations

- ... since less than half of the jobs were « teleworkable » without deep evolution**
- Reorganisation of work processes, internal information exchanges, customer services, orders, etc. are sources of savings and resilience of the business, but it takes time and commitment of middle managers**
- Unwanted mobility was often the result of poor organisation of big organisations. Reduce daily commuting mobility is good for the planet but disturbing for transport company managers and mobility planners**

Social Distancing in Public Transport ?

The cost of public transportation has increased (cleaning, information on regulation, enforcement ..) but its revenues have decreased :

- social distancing reduce capacity of carriages
- concern of local customers who have discovered walking and cycling or still preferred their cars ...
- Ridership decrease of 40 % in Paris and 15-20 % in metropolitan areas in 2020
- Return to « normal » is almost done in the regions but will be longer in Paris

Funding this urban service, essential for the attractiveness and sustainability of cities, will be difficult to reorganize.

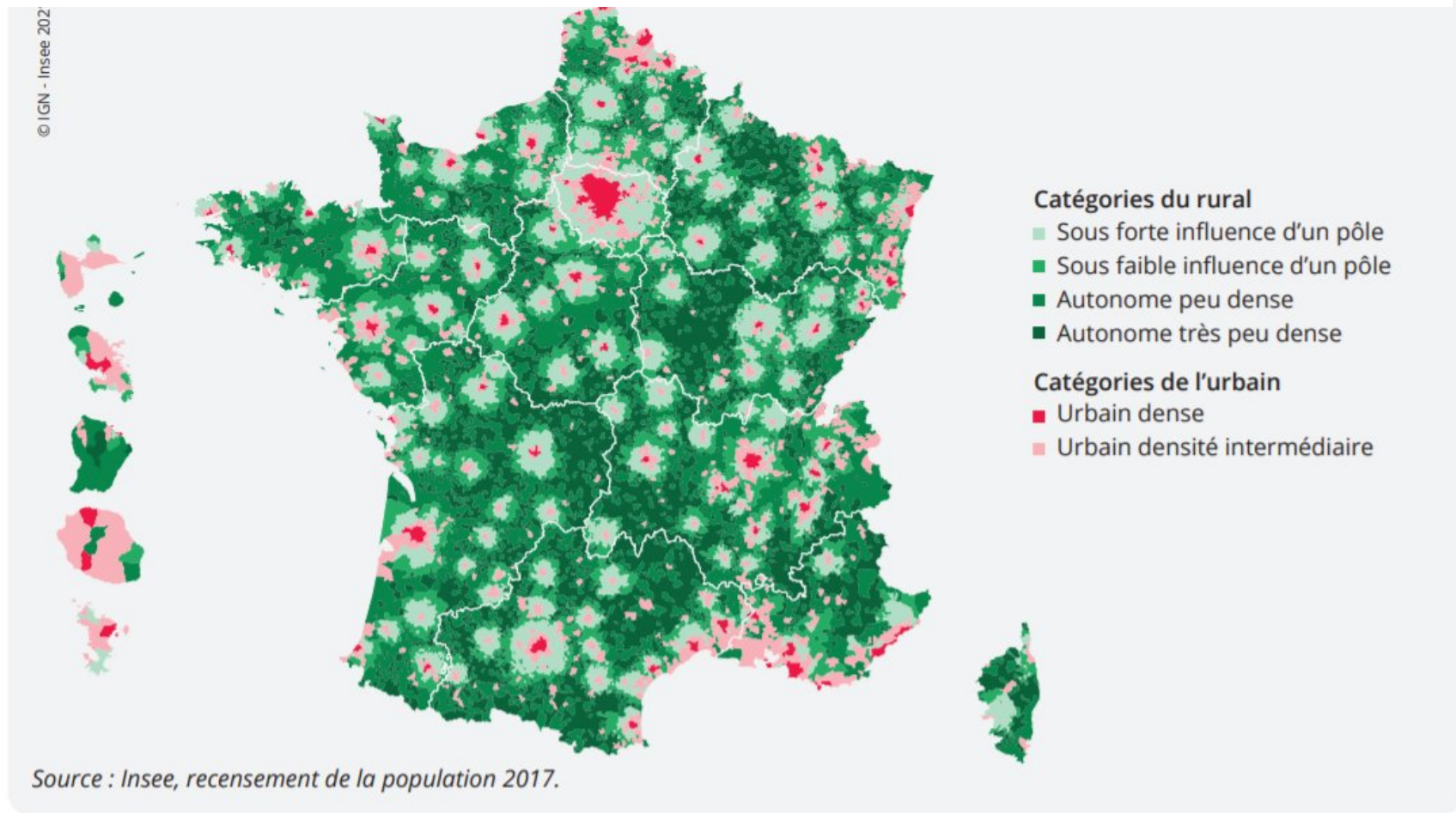
Regulation needed :

- **Automatic speed limitation for safety**
- **Fee for the use of public space**

Deployment likely limited to dense areas of major cities

Municipalities with low density and very low density 88% of municipalities. 30% of the population

Mobility for stricly car-depending zones

- The territories like others, are transforming under the pressure of environmental, energetical and numerical transitions.
- To be supported, projects must be part of effective solidarity and credible political goals. How to build projets for these territories now ?
- Digital technology makes it possible to measure the reality of uses, costs, emissions, price calculations and simulations... Digital is multi-modal, it is an effective way to integrate organizations and technologies: MaaS (Mobility as a Service)
- A territorial project requires a highly committed team

« Solutions » ?

- Autonomous shuttles have been tested successfully in dense areas. But they are expensive and would have too few customers
- Could they be adapted to low-density areas over greater distances for low-traffic roads ?
